1. The purpose of studying the discipline

The goal of mastering the academic discipline of dermatovenereology is to master knowledge in the field of etiology, pathogenesis, clinical and laboratory diagnostics, as well as the principles of treatment and prevention of skin and venereal diseases.

2. Summary of the discipline

1. General dermatology

Introduction to dermatology. History of dermatology. Deontology in the practice of dermatovenerologist. Structure and physiology of the skin. Features in children. Skin histology. Morphological elements of skin rashes. Methodology for examining a skin patient.

2. Private dermatology.

The section covers issues of etiology, pathogenesis, diagnosis and prevention of skin diseases. The issues of the diversity of clinical manifestations of various skin diseases and prognoses of the further course in childhood are considered.

3. Venereology

The primary period of syphilis. Secondary period of syphilis. Clinical characteristics of a typical chancre and its varieties. Serological reactions in the secondary period of syphilis. Method of diagnosis in the secondary period of syphilis. Confrontation. Tertiary period of syphilis. Congenital syphilis. Routes of transmission of infection to offspring. Statistics, social significance of congenital syphilis. Wassermanization of pregnant women. Classification. Fetal syphilis. Clinic and course of early congenital syphilis. Contagiousness of manifestations of early congenital syphilis, prognosis. Clinic of late congenital syphilis. Signs of reliable, probable dystrophy. Latent course of congenital syphilis. Gonorrhea in men. Trichomoniasis. Nonspecific urethritis of men. The causative agent of gonorrhea. Conditions of infection, routes of transmission. Gonococcal carriage. Clinical characteristics of gonorrheal urethritis and its complications in men. Methods of laboratory and instrumental diagnosis of gonorrhea. Principles of general and local therapy of gonorrheal urethritis and its complications. Criterion for cure of gonorrhea. Prevention public and individual.
