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#### I. THE PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE DISCIPLINE ACQUISITION

#### **1.1.** The purpose of the discipline acquisition

**The purpose** of mastering the discipline "Foreign language (Russian)" is the formation of communicative competence, i.e. the ability and willingness to carry out interpersonal and intercultural communication with native speakers of the Russian language, i.e.

- the development of skills and abilities of effective speech behavior in various situations of everyday communication;

 mastering written and oral forms of communication in Russian as a means of information activities and further self-education;

- formation of a modern linguistic personality;

- improving the general speech culture of medical students;

- formation of the basics of foreign language competence necessary in the future for professional intercultural communication.

## **1.2.** Objectives of studying the discipline:

- students` preparation to live and study in the Russian language environment;

– language skills development (phonetics, spelling, vocabulary, grammar) in accordance with the topics and communication situations chosen for elementary level of education;

- communication skills development for basic types of language activity (speaking, listening, reading, writing);

- students` familiarization with culture, traditions and real facts of life of the foreign language country within the framework of the topics, fields of study and communication situations corresponding to the experience, interests and psychological features of the students;

- development of the ability to represent their country of origin, its culture in the intercultural foreign language communication;

- gaining the ability to find the way out in the situation when the students lack the language means when receiving and transferring information;

- familiarization with accessible ways of independent learning of languages and cultures, with the usage of new information technologies.

## **II. REQUIREMENTS TO THE RESULTS OF DISCIPLINE ACQUISITION**
